

At a beehy holden for the Parish of Jago upon Tuesday in
whitfun week May the 27th 1782

Whereas there was lately the summe of twenty pounds ster
applotted upon the Parishioners for a Bell & Belfry, & money
for the better safety has been deposited in the hands of John
Campbell Clerk Vicar of Jago, and because money has
been reduced to a lower value by a Proclamation lately
issued forth by the Government, he the said John Campbell
has lately paid the foresaid money in specie and received
it to the present Churchwardens, and has taken a dis-
charge from them for the same; and whereas by a
late Act of beehy it was agreed that the same money
should be applied for the providing of a gallery in
the west end of the Church, but being insufficient
for that use, it is now further agreed by the Minister
Churchwardens & Parishioners then present
that the summe of thirty pounds ster be equally
applotted upon the Parishioners and levied of
them for completing the gallery above said, making
a new window in the west end, and other side
the ~~same~~ Charge. ~~with all~~ with all ex-
-pense directed.
