It was enacted concluded and agreed upon by the Minister  
Church wardens and Parishioners then present that the

of the said Parish which together with three pounds and  
eleven pence make the sum of 8-4-11 Nowing the Churchwardens

Churchwardens and side men detable charges - 1-0-0  
for working the Able Linnin - 0-2-0  
Accidental charges - 3-0-0  
for Elements for the Holy Communion 3-3-0  
twelve times - 3-3-0  
for getting the Elements - 0-6-0  
for Collecting the Pest - 0-6-0  
for appotting the Pest - 0-2-0

And that John Fisher y. younger of Kinnego and John  
Davison of Bocomra are chosen Churchwardens  
for this present year, and Thomas Rodgri of Drumcath  
and James Byers of Leaghary are chosen side men  
for this present year

Joseph Lynas of Drumcath is chosen overseer of  
the High way from Kilvergin River to Genderyn  
from the Church to Killemaine gate, John & Sebastian  
of Derygadda and Thomas Humphreys of Derymacast  
do oversee the way from the Brame froth to the bell  
Lindseys, John Cott in place of James Byers do oversee  
from ~~the~~ <sup>Killowning</sup> to Gartadon Bridge, ~~and~~ <sup>from the great road</sup>  
do oversee to uper sego gate; John Fisher y. elder and John Geary  
continues for Ballyneoney, for stable wick;  
Bryan M<sup>r</sup> Foxwell and George Black in place of James  
McKenney and Owen M<sup>r</sup> Grad do oversee from Knock Bridge  
do, wid: William Hill &c. William Lynas continues to oversee  
from Mr. Dynes Hill to Killemaine and from the black stone  
to the Low mill, M<sup>r</sup>. William Mather to oversee from Bocomra  
to Genderyn and from John Binkes to uper sego gate
