An assembly held in the parish Church of Jago for the said Parish on Easter Monday April the 10th 1718
It was agreed upon by the Minister, Churchwardens, and Parishioners then present that the sum of 12-13-10 be allotted a Levied ~~by the~~ ~~and~~ ~~of~~ the parishioners and Landholders of the said Parish by distress or otherwise according to Law
And two pounds fourteen shillings and eight pence now in the Churchwardens hands Make 15-8-6 2/3 for the use of
