

Memorandum that there is due to George
Ramsay the sum of two shillings ster,
April 25th 1721

At a vestry held in the parish church of Segs on Easter Monday
April 18th 1720 for the parish it was enacted concluded and
agreed upon by the minister churchwardens and parishioners
then present that the sum of 8-14-3 be applied & levied
of the parishioners and Land holders of the parish by distress
or other wise according to Law for the following
together with 1-11-3 in the church wardens hands
Make the sum of 10-5-6 for the uses following

- for bell man wages — 2-0-0
- Articles & charges — 1-5-0
- Accidental charges — 3-0-0
- for elements — 3-0-0
- for providing elem^t — 0-6-0
- for washing of surplice — 0-4-6
- for washing of table — 0-2-0
- linnen — 0-2-0
- for collecting of best — 0-8-6
- for applying of best — 0-2-0
