

At a vestry held in the Parish Church of Leggo on Easter Monday
 April the 10th 1721 held for the Parish, it was granted and
 agreed upon by the Minister, Churchwardens, and Parishioners
 then present that the sum of £ 12 - 6 be allotted and levied of
 the Parishioners and Landholders of the Parish by distress or
 otherwise according to Law for the use following vizt;
