 A Vestry held in the Parish Church of Sege on Easter Monday
 April 16th 1723 held for the Parish, it was enacted
 concluded and agreed upon by the Minister Church warden
 and Parishioners then present that y^e sum of 13-8-6
 be apploated and Levied of the Parishioners and Land holders
 of the Parish, which together with the sum of 0-18-8
 now in y^e Church warden's hands make y^e sum of 14-7-2-2 for
 the uses following (viz)
